Oakville Rangers Welcome Government of Ontario Support For 2026 Winter Classic

\$100,000 investment will support Canada's largest minor hockey tournament

January 7, 2026

Oakville, ON — Today the Oakville Rangers Hockey Club announced \$100,000 in funding support from the Government of Ontario to help deliver the 2026 Winter Classic, an annual marquee event that brings together athletes, families, and fans from across the country to celebrate Canada's national winter sport.

"The Oakville Rangers are grateful for the Government of Ontario's support of the Winter Classic," said John Verdon, Oakville Rangers President and Tournament Director. "This investment recognizes the important role community sport plays in bringing people together, supporting youth development, and creating memorable experiences for players and fans."

Running from January 15 to 18, 2026, the Oakville Rangers Winter Classic is Canada's largest minor hockey tournament, featuring 488 teams from across the country competing at rinks in Oakville, Mississauga, Burlington, Milton and Flamborough. The event is expected to attract more than 32,000 participants and spectators, generating an estimated \$14.2 million in economic impact for the province.

"Sport tourism is a major economic driver for the province and a key part of our government's plan to protect Ontario's economy," said Neil Lumsden, Ontario's Minister of Sport. "When it comes to minor hockey tournaments, the Oakville Rangers Winter Classic is unmatched in Canada for its size and scale, and we are proud to support an event that welcomes tens of thousands of visitors, drives local economic growth, and gives young athletes the opportunity to compete on the national stage, right here at home."

Ontario's investment will help enhance the Winter Classic experience for participants and spectators while supporting event operations and community engagement. The tournament has become a signature event for the Oakville Rangers, highlighting high-

level competition and reinforcing the club's commitment to player development and community building.

The Oakville Rangers Winter Classic attracts teams and visitors from across Ontario, Canada, and from the international community—strengthening local tourism and showcasing Oakville and Ontario as premier destinations for sport hosting. The Oakville Rangers thank the Government of Ontario for its continued commitment to amateur sport and for helping ensure the Winter Classic continues to thrive for years to come.
