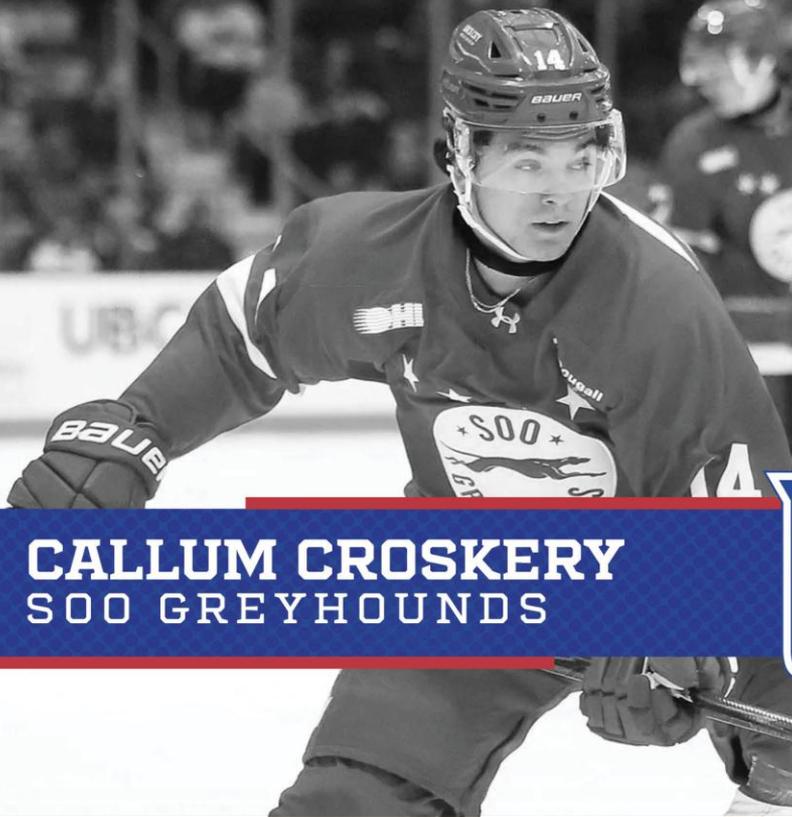

What do you mean, 'we are not for everyone'...why?

Response from Mike DeRenzis - Director of Player & Coach Development – Head Coach U12 & U18

In this new "Open Borders Hockey World" we live in, we want to compete with other organizations to try to become known as the best, but not at the cost of our organization's integrity.

We don't have players who play for free, we don't have a "money-man" or a parent running the team, and we don't tolerate selfishness. That's not what we're about. That's can't be part of the Championship Culture we're building here. We're here to teach lifelong lessons to players like facing adversity, team-work and working for what you want in life.

We won't run shortened rosters with only 8 forwards and 5 defensemen. We're not here to build short-bench U10 or U11 super teams. Our goal is long-term development to have success at U16, and the best U16 teams have depth — 3 lines that can play and deal with the normal adversity of hockey like injuries at U14 contact hockey where you need a full bench. That's why we start developing three full lines from the beginning here.

Which brings me to my final point: Development. Somewhere along the way, minor hockey in Ontario has started putting more emphasis on recruitment than development. We want to be known for development and providing pathways to the next level. We're not saying that if top talent shows up to tryouts from outside Oakville that we'd turn them away - we'll make adjustments to our teams to continue to improve. But we do hope the number of changes to our teams each year will be minimal. We don't want to replace half the team every season. Obviously, every age group is different and can present unique challenges, so we know that it can happen sometimes, but as a general approach that's not what we're trying to do here.

From a coaching perspective, we can teach a lot more if we're able to layer development year after year and build on what players learned the season prior (instead of having to re-teach things to half a new team). And for players, that consistency helps them learn even more than the average player and increases their development. If you look at countries like Sweden and Finland, they produce NHL players at a higher rate compared to the number of people who actually play hockey there. A big reason is their development model — players stay with the same clubs for most if not all of their careers. Players like Victor Hedman played with the same club from age 5 to 18. We know development isn't linear for every kid, they all develop at different rates - but that is the model and development path we're trying to create here for as many players as we can.

Our goal is to build a long-term development path where players start with the Rangers as early as possible, get selected at the OHL Draft, and if they're not ready for the OHL right away, continue along our pathway through the U18 and Oakville Blades programs. And at the end of their Oakville hockey journey, our hope is that your child represents the same Championship Culture, character and integrity that we believe in as an organization.

■ U10 AAA – Ian Starkman:

Ian grew up in Mississauga playing 9 years in the GTHL for both the Mississauga Reps and Rebels. In 2000 Ian played in the first ever OHL Cup losing in the finals in overtime. From there he played seasons of Junior B with the Guelph Dominators and for the Junior C Kingsville Comets before graduating with his Marketing degree from Sheridan College. His absence from hockey was short lived as he went on to be an assistant coach for 3 years with the Mississauga Senators. His ability to coach kids was noticed, as he moved on to be the Assistant Coach of the OJHL Toronto Patriots eventually winning the Southeast Championship in 2013 after 2 short seasons.

After that Ian then turned his focus to his own two boys coaching them in Timbits hockey and then into the head coach of the 2017 age group for U7 to U9 Oakville Rangers MD1 teams. Along with Head Coaching duties he is currently the VP U7 to U10 for the organization.

Ian is great at developing young players and teaching them the game. Working on their individual skills and showing them what it means to be a team. His success has led to many tournament wins and the current U9 team that leads the Tri County league. He is looking forward to the challenge of being the Head Coach for the U10 AAA Oakville Rangers for the 2026-27 season and hopes to continue his success on and off the ice for this young group.

While playing Junior A, he earned the role of team captain while also securing an NCAA Division I scholarship. Unfortunately, just five games into that season, Mike was diagnosed with a heart condition that forced him to stop playing at the age of 18. While this ended his playing career early, it opened the door to coaching and player development. That same season, Mike joined his Junior A team as an assistant coach and also became a practice coach with the Oakville Rangers. One year later, he transitioned into full-time coaching and founded his own hockey school, First Star Hockey.

Now with more than 15 years of coaching experience, Mike has coached at every level from U10 to Junior A and has guided teams through the U16 OHL Draft year multiple times. Mike plans to follow the same long-term development blueprint he used with his 2008 birth-year Oakville Rangers team—successfully guiding that group from U11 AAA to U16 AAA with some outstanding individual and team achievements: winning the 2024 U16 OHL Cup Championship; having 12 players selected in the U16 OHL Draft (including the #1 overall pick); one player committing to NCAA Division I Boston College (with three additional players selected in the U18 OHL Draft); one player representing Team Canada at the Youth Olympics in Korea at U16; two players winning gold with Team Canada at the U17 World Championships and competing at the U18 Hlinka Gretzky Cup; setting an OMHA record of 1,420 consecutive days undefeated in regular-season play from U12 to U16; and capturing multiple major tournament championships (Toronto Marlboros Holiday Classic, Toronto Red Wings Early Bird, Peterborough Petes Steve Richey Tournament of Champions, Oakville Rangers Winter Classic, etc.). ■ U13 AAA – Matt Perry

Matt was born in Toronto and raised in Mississauga and played minor hockey in the MTHL growing up. He attended the University of Western Ontario where he ended up staying in London and started his coaching career back in 2009.

Matt comes to Oakville with over 16 years of coaching experience at the AAA level with most of his coaching in the Alliance with the Jr. Knights and Elgin Middlesex Chiefs where he won 2 Alliance championships, made an OHF final and a trip to the OHL Cup and has twice been selected to the U15 coaching program of excellence. Matt is entering his 6th season coaching with the Oakville Rangers having been the head coach of the U16 2006 AAA team, an assistant on the U16 AAA 2007 team and the head coach of the U13 AAA-2 team and the most recently head coach of the U12 AAA team for 2025-2026.
